Eating out, Coffee & Drinks in Oxford

Exeter's Cohen Quad is adjacent to the Jericho district of Oxford, standing almost on the corner of Walton Street and Little Clarendon Street. Both are noted for their pubs, cafés and restaurants. On Walton Street one can find Mama Mia's pizzeria, Giggling Squid Thai, The Standard Indian, The Jericho Tavern, the Jericho Café and the pub 'Jude the Obscure', among others. On Little Clarendon Street one can find Pierre Victoire's, the Duke of Cambridge pub, and George and Davis' ice cream parlour. A short walk in the direction of the Maison Française d'Oxford brings you to North Parade, another centre for eating and drinking, with restaurants such as Little Venice and Jee Saheb, and pubs The Gardeners Arms and the Rose and Crown.

Oxford institution <u>Dailyinfo</u> has a Food and Drink page which you can search by cuisine and includes reviews. The Westgate Centre and Cornmarket St have most of the usual chain restaurants.

<u>Sichuan Grand</u> – amazing Chinese, far from the average takeaway, 5mins walk from Cohen Quad <u>Edamame</u> – tiny, delicious Japanese family restaurant, 15mins walk from Cohen Quad
